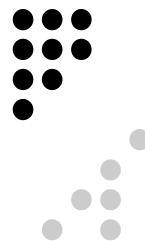

Tree Experts Lee Huss and Ralph Unversaw



Lee E. Huss earned a BS in forestry at Purdue University. He is a certified forester with the Society of American Foresters and a certified arborist with the International Society of Arboriculture. He is past president of the Indiana Arborist Association and founding president of the Indiana Urban Forest Council.

Huss is the city of Bloomington, Indiana, urban forester. He has been employed by the city for 23 years.



Ralph Unversaw started in forestry in 1973 working with his neighbor, a private forester. Ten years later he graduated from Purdue University with a degree in forest and wildlife management. That same year he started working with the Division of Forestry at Yellowwood State Forest

For the past 14 years he has served as the district forester for Monroe County, working within the Department of Natural Resources in the Division of Forestry. Their main goal is to provide forest management assistance to woodland owners and to provide forestry education programs for the public.
